Burns from fire	All participants	<ol> <li>Clear instruction to be given before commencement on use of matches/lighters.</li> <li>Maintain a safe distance from the fire</li> <li>Do not wear nylon clothes near the fire</li> <li>Do not play with fire</li> <li>An adult to remain with the fire and be vigilant at all times.</li> <li>Use long handled utensils</li> <li>Long hair and loose clothing are tied back.</li> <li>A first aider with first aid box adjacent with burn care products, clingfilm and water available in case of accidents.</li> </ol>	Confirmation that adult have seen the risk assessment, understands it and is taking responsibility to enforce controls.
Fire spreading	1. Clear the surrounding area of all combustible materials i.e. leaves, twigs, etc to form wide circle of bare earth.  All participants,  2. Check overhead for combustible materials i.e. tree branches to ensure fire		Confirmation that adult have seen the risk assessment, understands it and is taking responsibility to enforce controls.



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		5. Observe the strength of the wind and its direction	
Smoke inhalation	All participants	<ol> <li>Maintain a safe distance from the fire</li> <li>Wear protective equipment if required i.e. goggles and mask over mouth/nose</li> <li>Observe the wind direction and stand so the smoke does not blow towards you</li> </ol>	Confirmation that adult have seen the risk assessment, understands it and is taking responsibility to enforce controls.
